4 Axminster

Wheat averages 19½ bushels per acre, barley 27½, oats 27½, potatoes 150 bags, peas 15½ bushels, cyder 500 hogsheads.

Membury

Wheat averages 20 bushels per acre, barley 25, oats 40, potatoes 150 bags, peas 20 bushels, cyder 629 hogsheads.

Kilminster

Wheat averages 20 bushels per acre, barley 30, oats 40, potatoes 150 bags, peas 15 bushels, cyder 477 hogsheads.

For the three parishes, cyder totals 1,606 hogsheads at 5 bushels of malt to a hogshead will equal 8,030 bushels of malt. Total of the three parishes 2,003½ acres.

7 bow

This parish is not very extensive and a great part of it not adapted to tillage.

9 Cadbury

The crops in general are plentiful and most abundant.

17 Cullompton

This account has been taken from the reports of the farmers, who, from a jealousy which was not to be overcome, are supposed in general to have given in less than their actual growth, but a more accurate account could not be obtained without a survey of the parish.

18 Diptford

From the great reluctance of the farmers to disclose the amount of their tillage I have not been able to make the return before, and which now I fear is not very correct.

20 Dunchideock

The returns from the farmers in this parish are perfect and I believe, pretty accurate. The average quantity of wheat may be stated at 20 bushels per acre, barley at 25.

21 Dunsford

I could promise no return from about one-eighth part of the parish according to the rate. It is understood that there have been more

acres of corn sown last year than are in general on account of the enormous price.

- 32 Highampton  
The farmers very unwilling to make any return. This return rather under the real amount.
- 69 Hightly  
An extraparochial place adjoining the parish of Oakford.
- 4 Kilmington (included in Axminster notes above)
- 4 Membury (included in Axminster notes above)
- 62 Molland  
Wheat producing 2,300 bushels, barley 2,373, oats 4,036, potatoes 3,492, turnips greatly under an average crop.
- 67 North Molton  
Memorandum: no request made for this return last year, and obtained with some trouble and given with great reluctance by many farmers. A very extensive parish in which is some hundreds of acres of wasteland.
- 66 Northlew  
The farmers very unwilling to make any return, this return under the real amount but as near as could be ascertained.
- 68 Nymet Rowland  
Wheat, average crop per acre 15 bushels, barley 25, oats 27.
- 79 Rewe  
It may be supposed that the farmers have not given more, but rather less, in point of numbers of acres, as they have suspicions of the accounts relating to tithes.
- 116 Sidbury  
The soil of this parish is almost entirely marl and very unfavourable to the growth of potatoes.
- 127 Twitchen  
A small parish annexed to North Moton. Memorandum: No request made for this return last year.
- 129 Upottery  
Wheat, produce average about 20 Winchester bushels per acre, barley about 30, oats about 35, potatoes 200 bags, each bag weighing 120 pounds, peas a fair crop, turnips or rape a general good crop.

Venn Ottery

All the grain secured and crops of every kind promising an abundant produce. No lately enclosed lands. As curate of the parishes of Harpford and Venn Ottery I have endeavoured to order an exact account.
