5/12 Brougham

The crops of grain this year were generally good and universally well secured. Turnips and potatoes were never more abundant.

5/48 Morland

The best information I can procure or depend upon is that the late scarcity and dearness of grain has induced great numbers to plough and sow more land by one-fourth than is consistent with good husbandry in this parish and although the produce upon this increased quantity of ground has this season been very abundant and very well ripened and carried home without loss yet there is great reason to believe it would not be sufficient for the home consumption nor will it ever be possible to supply the manufacturing towns of ( ? ) and Lancashire without foreign importation of grain or the enclosure of more commons in Westmorland. I'm very well assured that the lower classes of people in ( ? ) must have died of want the last two years if they had not procured bread corn from some wastes lately cultivated in Cumberland.
